WILLIAM C. BROWNING SCHOLARSHIP in MINING ENGINEERING

Mining Engineers design, develop and manage facilities and systems for obtaining mineral and energy resources from the earth. Mining plays a significant role in the economy of Utah and the nation. The mining engineering curriculum at the University of Utah is fully accredited and widely recognized. The program prepares graduates to enter all major branches of the mining industry.

THE SCHOLARSHIP

Browning Scholarships are available to current students, resident and nonresident, entering freshman and transfer students who are interested in pursuing a degree in Mining Engineering. Students returning to the University and nontraditional students are encouraged to apply. Approximately 10 scholarships are awarded to incoming students each fall.

Recipients are awarded \$6000 per year (\$3000 per semester). Students may hold the *Browning Scholarship* concurrently with other scholarships provided they follow the approved curriculum in Mining Engineering and maintain full time status (30 credit hours/year).

The *Distinguished Browning Scholarship* is awarded to the top 10 students with a cum gpa of 3.400 after being in the program for at least one year. This designation awards an additional \$1000 per year for a total award of \$7000.

THE REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants should have a 3.000 cumulative gpa as determined by the most recent school transcript (high school or college)
- Course background in mathematics, physics & chemistry preferred
- Once approved the scholarship renews if a 3.00 cum gpa is maintained and the mining engineering curriculum is followed
- Recipient must complete 30 credit hours/year to receive funds
- Recipient award status is evaluated each semester based on cumulative gpa and the following of the mining curriculum

William C. Browning



William C. Browning, 1907 alumnus of the University, established a distinguished career in the mining industry. He was the first person to receive the Wall Scholarship in the School of Mines at the University of Utah. To show his gratitude for the scholarship, he established the Browning Scholarship Endowment to assist future generations of mining engineers in their quest for a college education.
